**YEAR IN REVIEW**

Covid-19 forced quite a few changes for everyone in 2020. The Construction Management Program at Sac State was no exception. Classes were held virtually in the Fall semester of 2020 and the Spring semester of 2021. Covid-19 also led to the first ever Virtual ASC Student Competitions. Sac State's Concrete Solutions team won 1st place during the Region 3 competition in October of 2020 and the Heavy Civil Team received a first place trophy during the Region 6 & 7 competition in February 2021. In the spring, SCMEF hosted a successful Annual Clay Shoot Fundraiser at Camanche Hills Hunting Preserve in Lone. 25 companies and 155 shooters attended the event. The SCMEF Scholarship Committee awarded \$15,500 in scholarships to 12 deserving CM students. And in the fall, the Evening with Industry and Fall Welcome events merged to one event for a tour of the Clark Construction job site followed by a networking mixer at the Hyatt. This was the first in person event for many of the CM students. This year SCMEF also hired a part-time employee, Jaime Dent, as an administrative assistant. Jaime is a shared employee with the CM Department.

Sac State's Concrete team pulled off another 1st place win at the 2020 **ASC Region 3 Student Competition**. The competition was virtual. The teams' winning formula was 3, 3 & 4 (three returning students, three new students, and four meetings to prep)

Sac State's Construction Management Heavy Civil team took 1st place at the 2021 **ASC Regions 6 & 7 Student Competition**. This was the first year that the competition was held virtually. This win was the teams' 5th podium visit in six years and follows two consecutive 3rd place finishes in a row.

SCMEF is proud to support the competitors, and would like to thank the coaches, corporate sponsors, and participating CSUS faculty for helping make this very important event so successful.

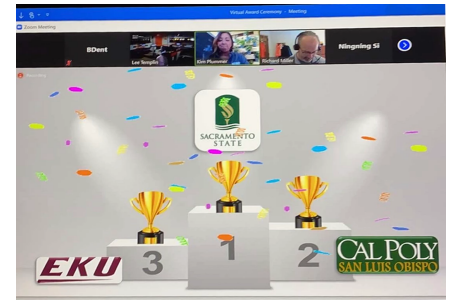
## EVENING WITH INDUSTRY AND FALL WELCOME
